*Thadious M. Davis is Geraldine R. Segal Professor of American Social Thought and Professor of English at the University of Pennsylvania. She received her Ph.D. from Boston University and has held tenured positions at UNC-Chapel Hill, Brown University, and Vanderbilt University. She is the author of several books on major figures in twentieth-century American literature, including Games of Property: Law, Race, Gender, and Faulkner's Go Down Moses (Duke, 2003), Nella Larsen, Novelist of the Harlem Renaissance (LSU, 1994), and Faulkner's "Negro": Art and the Southern Context (LSU, 1983). Her work and writing has been supported by major fellowships and grants, such as those from the Rockefeller Foundation and Ford Foundations and her scholarship has been recognized with major awards. She has also served on the editorial boards of numerous journals and in elected positions for national professional organizations including the American Studies Association and the Modern Languages Association.*
